### SPECIAL SESSION BUDGET POINTS

We all know these are tough times in our state, but our first mission in the Legislature is getting Florida's economy moving again. Here are some of the important issues discussed during the Special Session in regards to the budget.

Education — I understand the importance of a strong education system for the students, teachers and families of our state. All deductions were targeted to minimize the direct impact on students and classrooms.

Transportation —
During this Special Session, as part of our budget balance reduc-

tions we did not make any reductions to transportation work program categories and we did not transfer any transportation revenues to General Revenue.

Health Care — Within the health care budget, we examined our priorities and gave greatest weight to funding direct, critical services to Florida's most vulnerable citizens. This budget prioritized services to our most vulnerable and ensures that Medicaid eligibility and services were not impacted.

Environment — In deciding to freeze the Florida Forever program, we did not eliminate our

commitment to land acquisition. There is still \$50 million available to already inprogress restoration projects. Protecting Florida's environment is important, but it was realistic to prioritize essential health services, education and public safety over this program.

With a slowing economy and less revenues, common sense and fiscal reality dictates that we balance our budget with significantly less revenues that we had just a few months ago. We must continue to focus on doing what is best for Florida's families.

The House Councils and Committees will continue to conduct meetings until February 19th and then the first day of Session will be March 3, 2009.
