NAVY UDT SEAL MUSEUM VETERANS DAY



The 26th annual Muster at the Navy UDT Seal Museum on North Hutchinson Island promises to be a unique event this year. Every Veterans Day weekend, the Museum holds a three-day tribute to

the UDT and SEAL veterans which includes demonstrations and exhibitions.

This year the event includes the Navy Parachute Team "Leap Frogs" and a 5K beach run/walk and the UDT SEAL Museum dedication. The museum contains several rare artifacts from the founding of the SEALs to present-day activities of the US Navy SEALs. The names of all Underwater Demolition Team members — the "Frogmen" of World War II and modern Navy SEALs — who have died in the service of their country are carved into black, granite panels on the walls surrounding the sculpture and its reflecting pool.

REDISTRICTING-THE NEXT STEP

Chairman Weatherford and Senator Gaetz have presided over one of the most open and transparent redistricting processes in Florida's history. They held 26 meetings



around the state to gather public input and ideas before the process even began. They have taken input through the mail, email and social media platforms like Facebook and Twitter. Between the public meetings and our online portal, <u>FloridaRedistricting.org</u>, we have received almost 150 maps from the public, compared to only 4 maps a decade ago.

We are now at the beginning stages of members submitting maps, but every map drawn will follow the letter of the law, including Amendments 5 & 6, which were approved by voters last year. The Redistricting Committee and each of its subcommittees (House, Senate, and Congressional) have spent recent committee meetings examining key points of the law and studying examples of maps submitted by the public.

Members of the Florida House, have been asked to come forward with their own proposals by November 14. In addition, each of the House Redistricting Subcommittees have been asked to prepare three complete maps for members to review. The subcommittees will present these maps during each of the next two committee weeks (during the weeks of November 14th and December 5th).

Even though the initial deadline for public input has passed, we will continue to seek the public's comments throughout the process. You can continue to find information, receive news and updates, and submit comments as maps are unveiled at <u>FloridaRedistricting.org</u>. In addition, the House has set up a Redistricting page on its website, so individuals can find all Redistricting bills and amendments posted in one place: <u>MyFloridaHouse Redistricting 2012</u>.
